Smart classrooms have been installed in several classes. The smart tools available in the hands of teachers can be described as follows.

- 1. Projector: High resolution visuals can be projected on screens. It can be used to play motion pictures as well as still pictures. Teachers use it to play documentaries in combination with audio output facilities.
- 2. Power Point Presentations: The projector has built in connectivity with the computer system which used by the teachers to play slides while describing the topics and presenting the lessons in structured and systematic manner.
- 3. Smart Board: Smart board feature allows teachers to use board while presenting PPT slides. It is a convenient tool when teachers need further explanation of the slide and need to add instantaneous examples to a particular slide.

The institution is committed to maintain its examination calendar. It has taken all the necessary steps to compensate for the academic hours/ workdays lost due to Covid - 19 impact. The examinations were conducted during the narrow time span provided by the governments between the lockdowns in conformity with health advisory issued at the time. Commitment towards timely examination has helped college to keep/ maintain academic calendar on proper timeline.

The CIE system of the college can be explained as under/follows

- Pre-university / sent up tests are conducted prior to annual / term end university examination which reduce the failure rates in final examination
- Two continuous internal assessment (CIAs) are conducted per semester in P.G. geography and self-financing professional courses of B.B.A, B.C.A and B.M.C.
- All CIAs are followed by submission of assignments in each of

- the papers in the curriculum.
- Viva-voce examination is held in each of the papers in the curriculum as integral part of CIAs
- Practical tests are conducted in some courses of the programs i.e. statistics subsidiary, B.C.A
- Unit tests are conducted by the teachers at the end of unit and communicated to the HODs
- Skill tests are conducted in programs like B.C.A in well equipped computer lab
- Surprise tests are taken in the classrooms by the teachers to identify different levels of learners
- Regular College level competitions
- University level examinations are conducted as per university's time schedule

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The College maintains transparency and robustness in internal assessment by following ways. The nature of internal assessment and evaluation criteria are communicated to the students in the beginning of the semester. Decisions to conduct internal examination discussed by the college management (Principal, HODs and Teachers) after the start of academic session indicating that it is planned in advance. Based on the decision, internal examination time table is duly prepared and circulated in each department in advance. The approved time table is displayed on the notice board of the department and also personally informed to the students by the respective teachers. The test papers are evaluated and distributed to the students after every internal test. The answer script of the test is preserved in the departments till the completion of the student's course of study. The test marks are displayed on the notice boards of the departments. Marks of internal examination are displayed on the department's notice board. Those who fail to perform at satisfactory level are given opportunity to improve their marks by rewriting their examination. There are also norms of the college to take unit tests, which are taken by the respective

subject experts from time to time after completing specific unit of the syllabus in order to evaluate students learning level, but such tests are conducted by the respective HODs. Based on the performance, students are individually suggested to overcome their barriers.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Infrastructure is an important aspect of implementing the curriculum effectively through a high-quality teaching and learning process. The college understands that solid infrastructure creates a positive atmosphere and environment. It has a direct impact on student performance in terms of teaching and learning. Not only the students, but also the teachers and staff, are given a good working atmosphere in which to do their best work. The college's policy has been to equip teachers, staff, and students with the necessary infrastructure.

Patna College has been an institution recognized for its excellent education. It receives more than 600 students to the College courses through an entrance exam. Out of 600 plus seats available each year all seats are taken by qualifying students. The Vocational Courses - BBA, BMC and BCA- has 60 seats, 60 seats and 30 seats respectively. Accordingly, each year 150 students take admission in Vocational Courses after qualifying the entrance test. To sum it up, Patna College in any academic year teaches 2250 students (traditional 600 X 3 = 1800; Vocational 60 X 3 + 60 X 3 + 30 X 3 = 450; Total 2250 students).

Patna College is well equipped with appropriate infrastructural facilities to meet the educational needs of such a large number of students. There are almost 55 classrooms at the College. The

classrooms are well-lit, well-ventilated, and spacious. Faculty members use microphones and audiovisual tools in addition to the lecture method of instruction for successful problem solving. The college also contains 4 lecture theatres, 2 seminar halls, 2 laboratories, and 4 computer labs in addition to classrooms. Laboratory rooms are accessible for the Psychology and Geography curriculums, and laboratory experiments are conducted. The whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled for the benefit of students and faculty.

Patna College has adequate number of computers to fulfill the academic requirements of the students. These Computers are kept in Patna College library, BCA Department, BMC Department and BBA Department. The presence of adequate number of computers is helpful for students including those of Vocational Courses.

- The Administrative Block of the college consists of the Principal's Office and the Accounts Office.
- The magnificent Multi-Purpose Seminar & Conference Hall is located at the administrative block. Academic events like conferences, seminars, talks etc. and student activities are hosted in these halls.

- Class rooms have green, white, black and graph boards

- The campus has multiple hostels with lush green lawns for students.
- Students' Common Room with washroom facility is available.
- A good and hygienic canteen facility.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

Patna College focuses heavily on students' total personality development. Aside from academic success, the college has always sought to strike a balance between academic objectives, athletics, games, yoga, and cultural activities.

The College hosts cultural events and encourages students to attend in order to familiarize them with India's diverse and dynamic culture, which includes dance, languages, music, and architecture.

A sports committee functions at the College. It has a large number of members and is led by a President. Through their representation, the students are also represented. The committee is supported by the College through a sports fund.

Patna College has kept its infrastructure in good shape. It features three different playgrounds. In addition, the college has all necessary cricket equipment, including a cricket team; similarly, there is a cell, net, pole, and a football squad for football. Similarly, for Volleyball, Kabaddi, Basketball, and Hockey, the college provides all of the necessary equipment. Shortput, Discuss throw, Javeline throw, High Jump, Long Jump, and other games are played in college.

Patna College also includes a Common Room where indoor games such as chess, badminton, table tennis, and carrom are organized. The Gymnasium at the College was fully functional until 2004, although

it currently requires considerable repair work. Patna University hosts a centralised yoga class at the PU dispensary, which is open to both students and faculty.

Games and sports:

The college showcases its spirit in programmes such as Annual Sports events or by showing its real participation in state or national level events. The College Cultural Committee had also facilitated the participation of students in Tarang Cultural Festival which was organized by LNMU at Bihar level. The College also participated in Eklavya Sports programme

- College has two conjoined spacious playground having area of 90,000 sq.ft. (appx.) and 70,000 sq.ft (appx.). It is used by students to practice and play various outdoor games and sports such a cricket, football, track and field sports etc.
- The size of the third ground is approximately 1000 sq.ft.
- Every year various sports events, group display like yoga, aerobics and PT are organized
- Annual Sports Day is celebrated with full zeal and zest.
- The campus had Basketball Court which has now been dismantled for reconstruction and will soon be available for the sport.
- Meditation & yoga centre of college is also a major attraction among students

Cultural activities:

Notably, the college has a Cultural Committee which is administratively linked with the University Cultural Board at the top level. It frequently organizes debate, essay and quiz competition. The College Cultural Committee also enthusiastically participates in innumerable events which were organized under the umbrella of Patna University Centenary Celebration Programmes.

- For various cultural and extracurricular events the college has sufficient infrastructure with good audiovisual facility where students perform various cultural activities
- Various important days are also celebrated under departmental banners
- Awards and certificates are distributed to meritorious students and winners of different events during Annual day Functions

Fire safety facility:

- The fire safety devices have been installed throughout the premises, especially in the laboratories that are at high risk.
- College also arranges mock drill and fire safety drills from time to time to make students aware, sensitize and prepare for any fire hazard.
- The fire fighting equipments and extinguishers are audited regularly for quality check.

Safety and CC TV facility:

- To ensure safety and security of teachers and students, the college has a dedicated police post inside the premises.
- The college main gate is manned by guards round the clock.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The sobriquet 'Gyan Mandir,' which has become a synonym for the Patna College library is a part of Patna University and participates in a number of online repositories.

We believe that a digital library would be beneficial to both students and teachers. The library has a large collection of books, numbering in the thousands. The college library is in the process of being automated, with all books, papers, journals, and other pertinent material being digitised with the goal of providing remote access to Patna College library resources. We anticipate that our library will be totally automated in a few months. It will make it easier for students to access e-books, e-resources, and other materials. Teachers will profit from this as well. Aside from that, many books are available in other departmental libraries.

Patna University Library has taken subscription of J-GATE through e-Shodhsindhu Consortium. Patna College is planning to get an annual subscription of INFLIBNET.

The National Digital Library of India, a government of India initiative, is accessible through the Patna University Library. Almost all of the teachers, non-teaching staff, and students from all of Patna University's constituent colleges are currently enrolled in this library. Faculty members from Patna College are also involved.

Patna University Library has signed a MoU with Shodhganga and is now

using URKUND, an anti-plagiarism programme, to review Ph.D thesis and research articles before they are made public. Patna University is working to expand this service to include college libraries as well.

In the session 2020-21 a lot of infrastructural and procedural upgrades were stalled due to the Covid-19 lockdowns. We are now resuming such developmental procedures and it will have a positive impact on our structure in the coming sessions.

In last two years the covid-19 lockdowns and protocols has affected the library footfall significantly. But as things are getting normal we will soon see a rise in footfall.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The requirements of the 21st century cannot be fulfilled without a good IT infrastructure. So owing up to the realistic IT infrastructural requirements Patna University has a well-equipped and continually updated IT infrastructure and Wi-Fi connection to meet the demands of students, teaching staff, non-teaching employees, and the society in general.

The key points about Patna College IT infrastructure.

- Patna College campus is a WiFi enabled campus in true sense.
- The Wifi infrastructure of the campus comes under the "Saat Nishchay Program" of the State Govt. and is constantly upgraded and monitored for security and functionality by a dedicated team.
- Each department has their own login credentials to access the internet.
- Students have their individual registration for their WiFi and can access the internet 24x7.
- There are almost 1037 student accounts accessing the WiFi.

In addition to this, Patna College also has a personal paid Wi-Fi.

Under PU's NME-ICT, there is 1 GBPS connectivity in the network. There are 10 IPs available for the University. The University promotes open source software. University Telephone Exchange with latest technology BTS and MDS systems is in place at Patna University Computer Centre for better connectivity.

Patna College Computer Laboratory has significant number of Computers and functional SMART Classroom. A well established Language Lab and a partial Media Lab facility i.e. Content development unit have been put in place. Various departments running traditional as well as Vocational Courses like BBA, BCA and BMC are equipped with latest version of Computers, Laptop, Projector, Printer, Sound System etc.

Hardware

- Institute has 65 Desktops/Workstations for students and a laptops which are available for faculties.
- The college uses Dell, Acer & HP workstations/laptops.
- Computer Labs have adequate number of desktops for students in allotted group/batch.
- There are Multifunctional Laser & Deskjet printers in the departments & administrative block.
- The college uses 13 LCD projectors (Epson/Benq/), 3 in the computer Lab, 1 in the IQAC room & seminar hall and the rest are used for teaching in the classrooms.
- This infrastructure is complemented by interactive teaching board etc.
- The College takes the service of professional IT consultants from time to time for maintenance and support of the ICT infrastructure.
- In general, computing and internet facilities are available to all teachers and students on the campus.
- The institution provides access to desktop systems and laptops to both faculty and students which allows them to use computer aid for academic projects, practical sessions and for learning as per their curriculum.
- To make the learning process more effective various innovative methods are used by the teachers. This includes giving group assignments and having power point presentations, where students can discuss and explore their knowledge together. Learning combined with visual presentations or working on certain software is much more enjoyable and comprehensive for the students.

Software

- The desktops/laptops are running on windows 7, windows 7 pro, windows 10 and windows 10 pro & windows 11.
- Most of the desktops have MS office installed and a few are running on office 365 and office 2016 pro. Open source software's are used wherever necessary.
- Office automation packages like Open Office, MS Office and Antivirus are purchased by the college and updated regularly.

The College ensures regular maintenance and upkeep of all infrastructural facilities. Care Taker supervises the maintenance work carried out by trained staff. Maintenance is also outsourced to appropriate external agencies.

Furniture and equipment are purchased on regular basis as per the requirements with Purchase Committee consisting of the Principal as Chairman, Bursar, faculty members and Accountant. Regular meetings are held to approve necessary purchases for maintenance of College infrastructure. IT machines and softwares are continuously upgraded to ensure the market relevance of acquired skills.

Classrooms

 well-functioning and maintained classrooms and tutorial rooms.
- Faculty in-charge in every Classroom help students with ICT related work and report to the full time Care Taker/agency with respect to maintenance of the classrooms. Servicing of Class Projectors' Lenses and Filters is done annually.
- A team of efficient workers and gardeners is responsible for keeping the college premises clean.

Laboratories

- The College has Labs with tools, maintained by a Lab Attendants. The precision of the Lab instruments is frequently checked internally with external help taken whenever required.
- The computer/language lab containing print, audio-visual and teaching-learning resources is maintained by a designated staff member.

Library

A Library Committee comprising of the Principal, Librarian and TICs of all Departments meets once a year to discuss improvement/update of facilities provided by the library.

The Library is maintained by staff members headed by the Librarian. Regular dusting of books is done and occasionally, vacuum cleaner is used. Books are sent every year for binding, to keep them in good form.

IT Infrastructure

All computers in the college have UPS facility with Server Windows monitored and Antivirus updated on a daily basis and full system backup of Office done every quarter.

A Sports Committee comprising of 2 faculty members from the Department of Physical Education and faculty members from other Departments holds regular meetings for maintenance of sports infrastructure. The College has a Sports Store room with sports equipment for all played sports.

Patna College is a constituent unit of Patna University. Patna University mobilizes its funds received mainly form the state government and The UGC under various Heads & expenditures of the university. Funds received from state government are spent on payment of salary of teaching and non-teaching staff of the university. This also holds good for Patna College. Each and every amount of fund received from state joint and UGC are at per with budget allocation. Budget of the university is prepared keeping in mind development criteria of the university. Accordingly provision are made in Budget, which is prepared by a team of experts under the direct supervision of the financial admirer of the university. Financial committee, Senate and syndicate which is intimately made by the state government and the fund is sanctioned which is deployed on different heads of expenditures in accordance with the approval of various stationary committees constituted by the university time to time for efficient are of funds/grants received from government.

The University follows cent percent transparency in use for funds. Further, grants received from UGC are mainly embarked for infrastructural relation growth and development mark of the university.

UGC grants are spent after approval from building committees sales and purchase committee, Finance Committee and Other stationtory committees of the university. All these committees are chaired by the principal of college. The College also mobilizes its resources from funds generated from self-financing and spent, from this fund after getting approval from financial authorities of the college. Resource mobilisaiton is also carried out by the following means:

Students fees

Interest on campus fund

Overhead charges from the research grants received from various gent and non-gent agencies.

Funding from alumni deviors.

Fund generated from above are principally need for maintenance and development of college. To facilitate the above initiatives, the college provides space on lease to various commercial utility facilities for students, faculty members and officials of the college such as banks (Allahabad Bank, P.U. branch) Post office, Railway reservation counter, etc.

Optimum utilisation, utilisation of funds is ensured through:
